We advance equitable strategies to support people experiencing homelessness and housing instability.




Education




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Why Health & Housing?

Discoordination between institutions


Poverty, gentrification, systemic racism

Distrust of medical system


Lack of housing options

Health & Homelessness

Unaccompanied youth and young adults (ages 12-26)



YYA Health Outcomes

- Over 50% of YYA experiencing homelessness have a drug or alcohol use disorder, as well as overrepresentation of mood, psychotic, and trauma-related disorders
- Suicide is the leading cause of death of YYA experiencing homelessness. A study reported 48% of women and girls and 27% of men and boys have attempted
- Disproportionate anxiety, depression, self harm, PTSD, conduct disorder, HIV/AIDS, and early death

Health & Homelessness

Families (an adult caring for at least one child)



Family Health Outcomes

- Children experience greater behavioral and mental health issues, adolescent depression, substance use disorders, and teenage pregnancy
- Infants at greater risk of respiratory infections, fever, allergies, injury, and developmental disorders
- Women and people with uteruses have elevated risks of reproductive health issues: STIs and other infections, early or unplanned pregnancy, miscarriage, forced births, sterilization, and abortion

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Statewide Research

Better understand what is going on across Washington State at the intersection of housing and healthcare for those experiencing homelessness, particularly families and youth and young adults (YYA).

Our Approach

We wanted to understand the intersection of health and housing from different sources and experts at each step of the way







Landscape Scan

Literature review and interviews with housing service providers

Listening Session: Provider Groups

3 listening session groups of providers across the 5 counties of focus

Listening Session: YYA Clients

2 listening session periods with YYA clients 1:1

Key Informants

33 total interviews were conducted across King, Pierce, Snohomish, Spokane, and Yakima counties with sprinkles from Walla Walla and Okanogan.

- 9 organizations have a health-based component
- 22 are housing programs
- 14 offered other social services, were administrative-focused, or funders


