"My favorite part of the program was that Mike would always call us and check in on our progress."

A counsellor at MAP High School in Spokane (a specialized school for grades 9 -12 where all students are dealing with mental illness) referred a Single Mother and her 16 year old daughter to Youth Reengagement Specialist, Mike at Open Doors for help with their housing situation. They were temporarily staying with a former partner of Mom's, in a far from ideal situation but at least they had a roof over their heads.

Before that they had been living "Doubled Up" with a family member and once the apartment complex found out they needed to leave quickly so that the family member's lease wasn't terminated.

Mike helped them begin looking for housing, but it quickly became evident that a 10-year-old eviction during a divorce would be a big barrier to finding a place. They were met with zero sympathy and comments like "Don't even apply" from a couple of apartment complexes. Obviously, this was a very discouraging process. Mike kept morale up and offered to speak to a private landlord on the family's behalf. After explaining their circumstances and with much negotiation, Mike used HSSP dollars to pay their move in costs of \$4200 for their first and last month's rent and housing deposit. They were approved and moved into their own home on 20th December, just in time for Christmas. But Mike's help did not stop there - he also provided them with over \$200 worth of household items to make their new place feel like home and connected them with SNAP Food benefits and an organization called Foundational Community Supports in Spokane for additional, ongoing support. Nicely done, Mike!
